## **Annual Parish Meeting**

### **MINUTES**

#### **of a meeting held at**

#### **Hessett & Beyton Village Hall, Hessett at**

#### **7.30am on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> May 2018**

(The Annual Parish Meeting is a meeting of the village, and not a Council meeting.)

The Chair opened the meeting and welcomed those attending. He explained that copies of written reports were available and that members of the public would be invited to ask questions or make comments after each report.

- 1.** Apologies for Absence - There were none.
- 2.** The minutes of the previous Annual Parish Meeting were agreed to be a correct record and so were signed as such by the Chair.
- 3.** The Chair of Hessett Parish Council gave a report and invited questions; there were none.
- 4.** A written report had been received from the Chair of the Village Hall Committee and was considered by the meeting. Cllr Heymoz, a member of the Hall committee added that she and her husband, who are neighbours of the hall itself, had replaced the fence that had blown down between their garden and the hall. There were no questions.
- 5.** A written report had been sought from the Hessett Charities but none had been received and no representative was present.
- 6.** A written report from the Friends of Hessett Church had been received and was augmented verbally by the Chair of the Friends, Mr Phil Barrett. He explained that the name of the group was being changed to Hessel Church Preservation Society and efforts were underway to re-invigorate the group. There were no questions.
- 7.** Open Forum - A member of the public reported that the churchyard was looking very poor and is heavily overgrown, especially towards the rear. This was noted and it was suggested that the Parochial Church Council (PCC) be contacted as the Churchyard is the responsibility of the Church and no members of the PCC were present.
