LAVENHAM

Natural History Group: The November meeting of the Lavenham Natural History Group was held on Wednesday, November 4 in the Guildhall.

Robin Ford opened the meeting and welcomed everyone and then introduced the speakers, Tina and Roger Loose, who talked on "Spring in the Garrigue", a region of southern France. The Garrigue is mainly a limestone area with very poor soil and shrubby vegetation. Between these areas there are valleys wich are more fertile, growing good arable crops and vineyards. The plants are subjected to very hot and arid conditions in the summer. To cope with this, the native plants have ways of preventing excess loss of moisture through their leaves. Some have a waxy covering whilst others are downy or are rolled up.

We were shown six specimens of different species of shrub oak, mostly evergreen.

One of their walks led to a Roman site which was full of wild irises and many orchids. Their fine pictures showed many different orchids, including a giant one which can grow to one metre and is related to our lizard orchid. Butterflies were plentiful, including different species of swallowtail and the Granville fritillary. One of the sites they visited was a Roman aqueduct, a very impressive structure, which is a World Heritage site. Roger is to be congratulated on his excellent photography. This husband and wife combination produced a very interesting talk and had us all wanting to visit the area.

The next meeting on Wednesday, December 2 at 7.30pm in the Guildhall, will be a members evening, when some of the members will be giving short presentations on various wildlife subjects.

HESSETT

Service for renovated Hessett memorial: The First World War memorial in Hessett was rededicated at a short service on Sunday, November 8 which included a muffled peal of church bells.

The cross, erected in 1920, has been renovated to mark the centenary of the war. The project was organised and funded by the Friends of Hessett Church with other private donations.

The Rev Nick Cutler conducted the service and Michael Poulter, chairman of the Friends of Hessett Church laid a wreath. Andrew Robinson gave a Bible reading and Rachel Chester played Last Post.

More than 50 people attending

the service were given a booklet with the stories of the 14 men from the village who died. The booklet has been researched and written by the Friends as a tribute to the 52 men from the village who enlisted to fight.

Half of the men who died belonged to the Suffolk Regiment and all but three are buried or remembered on memorials overseas.

Two of the men are buried in Hessett churchyard. John Whiting died of his wounds in a military hospital in London after being shot at the Somme in 1916 and William Borley died from influenza three days after the Armistice.

Copies of the 36-page booklet are on sale in the church at £3.
