Heath Policy

- 1. The Heath consists of two adjacent enclosures, west of Heath Close and south of Heath Road, and is intended to provide a peaceful open recreation space for the enjoyment of all residents.
- 2. Users of the Heath must adhere to any notices displayed on or around the Heath.
- 3. From time to time the Council may develop planting schemes for the encouragement of wildlife but such schemes will not prejudice the generally open nature of the Heath.
- 4. There is no vehicular access to the Heath (and it should be noted that there is no public vehicular right of way over the privately owned track leading to the Heath).
- 5. Nothing shall be done on the Heath that would be likely to limit the enjoyment of the Heath by other residents
- 6. Nothing shall be done on the Heath that would be likely to be prejudicial the fauna and flora to be found there.
- 7. Mowing, harvesting or picking on any part of the Heath without the express written consent of the Council is prohibited, other than the harvesting of hedgerow berries.
- 8. Dogs are welcomed on the Heath provided that:
 - a. They must be under control at all times;
 - b. Excrement must be immediately collected by the person responsible for the dog and taken away from the Heath.
- 9. Gates must be closed behind users.
- 10. Ball games are prohibited on the Heath (The Village Green is available for that purpose).
- 11. The flying of kites is dangerous because of overhead cables and is expressly prohibited.
- 12. Nothing must be installed, placed or stored, nor disposed of, on the Heath.
